~ For the last several weeks, Phyllis and I have been speaking with two individuals about salvation and baptism. One Icelandic/Irish young lady has been attending church for several months, has heard the gospel repeatedly, and was even there for last month's baptisms. She asked if she could also be baptized. Another young man from Equatorial New Guinea asked if he could help us in our ministry. He has also been attending for many months. Our policy for helpers in the ministry is strict, but it begins with a clear salvation testimony and following Jesus' example in baptism. Phyllis and I spoke with both individuals, explaining the importance of faith and belief prior to baptism. Both clearly and openly stated that they believe in the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus and rest in what the Scriptures teach about Christ. Having confirmed this with them both, we scheduled their baptisms. Praise God that people continue to see the need to reject their pasts and dreams and choose to follow the life Christ offers! Please pray for these two individuals to continue living for Jesus and growing in faith. (Their names are Ásta – pronounced *ow-st-uh* – and Alberto.)



Serving Tables

~ In the book of Acts, there were ministry details that needed to be addressed and handled. The early disciples of Christ deemed it unwise to refrain from ministering to people as a result of the day-to-day work related to ministry, "...It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables" (Acts 6:2). As a result, they decided to delegate the maintenance needed for ministry to trustworthy individuals, "Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business" (Acts 6:3). This allowed the Christian leaders to focus on teaching, discipleship, and prayer, "But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:4). While my parents have been in the U.S., the majority of my time has been taken up with prayer, lesson preparation, discipleship, and visitation (i.e., "ministry of the word"). This necessitates that the background work ("serving tables") has been neglected by me. Thankfully, some wonderful people have taken up the slack and helped maintain the ministry. Most notably, my wife has helped me carry the burden. I would have had so much work if it were not for her. God has given me such an amazing lady! I have also been tremendously helped by fellow missionaries serving in Iceland. They have been such a blessing, taking the day-to-day stresses off of my plate. Finally, our sweet church plant has stood its ground. They have boldly stood by us as we minister to children and share the love of Jesus with this community.
